## Yossi Klein Halevi

Senior Fellow at the Shalom Hartman Institute in Jerusalem

Yossi Klein Halevi is a senior fellow at the Shalom Hartman Institute in Jerusalem and contributing editor to *The New Republic*. He also frequently contributes to the op-ed pages of leading American newspapers, including *The New York Times*, the *Wall Street Journal* and the *Los Angeles Times*. Halevi is a regular commentator on Israeli and Middle East affairs and has appeared on CNN, BBC and NPR, among other media outlets.

Halevi is active in reconciliation efforts between Muslims and Jews and serves as chairman of Open House, an Arab-Jewish coexistence center in the town of Ramle, near Tel Aviv. His last book, *Like Dreamers*, follows the lives of seven paratroopers

from the 55th Brigade who played a pivotal role in reuniting Jerusalem during the 1967 war. This diverse band of brothers went on to play central roles in Israeli politics and society, shaping Israel's destiny long after their historic victory.

## Note from The Rabbi



As the new moon of Elul nears, I cannot help but consider a range of feelings in contemplating that this year will mark my 20<sup>th</sup> High Holy Days as a rabbi. I am humbled by the sacred opportunity I have been blessed with during these two decades. Leading any congregation in the spiritual and deeply personal process of repentance and prayer is an honor beyond explanation. Yet the fact that you have made it possible for me to be your rabbi for these past twelve years has been a blessing and a gift for which I am immeasurably grateful.

As we prepare this summer for the upcoming High Holy Days and new Jewish year, I want to share many exciting developments and transitions for our historic congregation.

- There have been many questions as related to the process in seeking a new Cantor or Cantorial Soloist for our Holy Congregation. I am so pleased to share that our Search Committee which is under the leadership of our outstanding Co Chairs Gail Baer, Robin Roeder and Jacki Cohen has accomplished a great deal over the past few months. They are hard at work in finishing our list of Core Competencies along with working closely with me and Rabbi Keller on reviewing our Job Description and expectations for a new professional in this position. Our hope is to have the job open for applications before the High Holy Days. I know you understand how important it is for us to find an outstanding professional for this position, so we will be thorough, methodical and patient as the process moves forward.
- I am thrilled to confirm that Rabbi Keller and I will be joined by a very talented local vocalist named Robert Erlichman for the upcoming High Holy Days. Robert grew up in the Valley and attended Congregation Beth Israel as a preschooler and student in our Religious School. Robert attended the Manhattan School of Music in New York City, and has been the student of celebrated tenor Neil Rosenshein since 2007. During his years of study in New York, Robert led High Holy Day Services Congregation Beth El, a Conservative Synagogue in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania for two years. Robert is exceptionally talented vocalist and I know we are all going to find him to be warm and of strong spirit. - I am also very pleased to share that during all *B'nei Mitzvah* for the upcoming year (August 2015 June 2016) we will be joined on the bima by local Jewish vocalist <u>Susan Collins</u>. Susan has been our substitute Soloist for the past two years during *Shabbatot* and worked closely under Cantor Shpall's mentoring in her studies of Jewish music and liturgy. She is a delightful presence on our bima and we look forward to celebrating our simchas together with Susan throughout the year.
- In the coming weeks you may notice that many of our prayer books, *Mishkan T'Filah*, are missing from our shelves. When the first edition of these books was published by the Central Conference of American Rabbis (CCAR), there were faulty bindings attached to each edition. We have decided to ship back every book with a damaged binding to the CCAR for repair and the "turn around" time for each book is approximately 4-6 weeks. We will be shipping the books in batches of 150-200 siddurim and we are currently awaiting the first 180 siddurim to be returned shortly. Please know that we will have enough books for our Shabbat Services on hand until they are all repaired.
- We are also excited to share that we will be purchasing new High Holy Day Machzorim (High Holy Day Prayer Books) entitled Mishkan HaNefesh, which will be available starting on Rosh Hashanah 5777 (2016). Please look for several copies of the new books which will be placed in the Foyer at Chaparral Christian Church for you to see during the upcoming High Holy Day Services. As is our custom, books will be available for dedication and to memorialize love one's with information you will find on the pews during the upcoming High Holy Day season.

Congregation Beth Israel is beginning its second century by reinvigorating our Goldsmith Sanctuary.

Over the past year, our CBI Sanctuary Committee has explored ways to enhance the serenity, peace and beauty of our most holy community space. The stained glass artist who designed our project have created holy spaces for synagogues throughout the United States. Our renovation will include new stained glass windows, ark doors, ark interior, eternal light, Holocaust memorial and Torah restoration.

The CBI Board of Directors approved the renovation project pending funding. We now turn to our congregants before embarking on this exciting journey.

In Parshat Terumah, God directs Moses, "Let them make me a Sanctuary so that I may dwell among them". (Exodus 25:8). We learn from this famous passage that the Sanctuary enables us to have God dwell with our community.
